We are committed to eliminating acts of modern-day slavery and human trafficking within our business and from within our supply chains. Organisational Structure, Business and Supply Chains

We are a global provider of cloud-based spend management solutions. Founded in 2001, Medius is owned by the global investment firm Marlin Equity Partners. In 2019 Medius acquired the UK entity Wax Digital. The group has offices in Sweden (HQ), the United States, the United Kingdom, Australia, Denmark, Norway, the Netherlands and Poland. Our supply chains are all wholesale or retail suppliers of infrastructure, equipment, labour and materials relating to software production and office administration.

Policy on Slavery and Human Trafficking

We are committed to ensuring that there is no modern slavery or human trafficking in any part of our business or in our supply chains.
